Numberblocks Mastering Maths

Numbers can be partitioned and combined in different ways.

Numbers can be anything i.e.

1 clap, 1 crayon, 1 jump

2 is made of 1 and 1, 1+1

3 can be made from 1+1+1 or 2 and 1 or 1 plus 2

4 can be made from 2+2 2+1+1 or 1+1+1+1

5 can be made from 2 plus 3 3 and 1 and 1 1+1+1+1+1

ICT

Algorithm; simple programming: the process or activity of writing computer programs. (Set of directional instructions)

Science

Vibrations - in the voice box (larynx) feels buzzy when you sing

Sound - vibrations that can be heard when they reach a person's or animal's ear

Bang - a sudden loud, sharp noise

Blow- force air through the mouth into (an instrument or device) in order to make a sound

Shake - move (an object) up and down or from side to side with rapid, forceful, jerky movements

Fast, faster, fastest - musical sounds

Slow, slower slowest - musical sounds

Quiet, quieter, quietest- making little or no noise

Loud, louder and loudest- making a lot of sounds

Low, lower, lowest - deep voice sounds

High, higher, and highest - high pitched voice sounds

PSHE

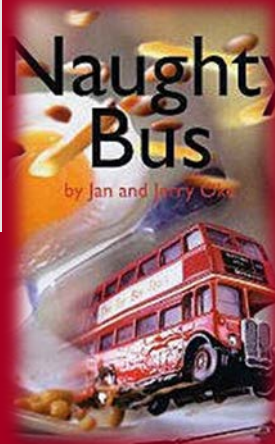
To understand that all families are valuable and special. To understand why it is important to share and cooperate with others. To explore diversity through thinking about similarities and differences.

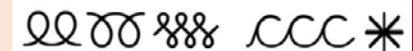
